When tragedy occurs

- · There is nothing normal about this situation.
- · Communication and respect are key.
- · You are a trusted part of their business; your super power is your skillset and knowledge of the business.
- How you can contribute will depend on the circumstances and the business dynamic
- Touchbase with extended family, emergency contact, neighbour or other consultant.



How you can help & support

- It comes down to: who you are, what you know and what you can do. Know your capacity and don't over promise.
- · If the situation calls for it put boots on the ground
- Media; if comfortable offer to act as family spokesperson. Have a plan
- Work out what has to happen and make it happen; this is critical if no one else can make a decision.



Look after yourself

- · It's a lot of responsibility in the worst circumstances
- Have good support around you.
- Upskill yourself; AICD, Leadership programs, Media Training & First Aid (both St John's & Mental Health Association)









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
