Scholarship recipients will be selected on the basis of their commitment to a career in agriculture, as well as their leadership potential.

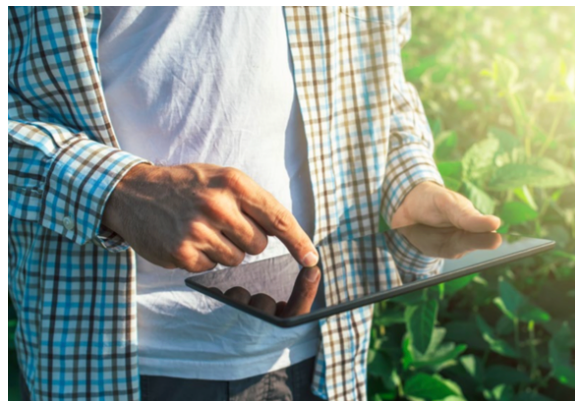
